Jenny Chambers, principal at [Central Fine Arts Academy](#) in Sand Springs, was happy to let us know that her school received the NAESP (National Association of Elementary School Principals) [Sharing the Dream Grant](#) announced this past September. The \$3000.00 they received helps to fund their Family Art Club Events (FACE). These evening events bring entire families into the school to expand the parents' knowledge of A+, the arts, and what is going on in their children's classrooms.



Jenny explains, "Last year we began by having two Family Art Club Events (FACE) in the spring. We had the families come in and participate in an art project with the entire family helping. The first event was held in February, so the project was a short lesson on presidents, with everyone making collages of Lincoln, Washington, or Obama. We served dinner and displayed the collages in the cafeteria, and families received a plastic container filled with art supplies to take home. The second FACE was held later in the spring, and the art project was an oil pastel picture in the Georgia O'Keefe style. Families received oil pastels and drawing paper to add to their home art box. We had over 150 families at the second event. This year we will host four FACE meetings, and we are expanding our offerings, too. It should be great! We are excited that this grant will allow us to continue to send art supplies home with the families."
